



Indonesia 2024 Elections: Navigating Dynasty Politics and Democratic Aspirations

Indonesia's Hedging Strategy and Global Maritime Ambitions: Indonesia's Global Maritime Fulcrum initiative and non-alignment policy reflect its endeavor to leverage its geographical advantage while navigating great power dynamics. China's interest in Indonesia as part of its Belt and Road Initiative contrasts with the US's vision of a free and open Indo-Pacific, with Indonesia skillfully hedging between both powers.

Economic Prospects and Democratic Stability: With a youthful demographic and projections placing Indonesia among the top six global economies by 2027, the election outcome is pivotal for the nation's future trajectory. The public's desire for stability and certainty, amidst global uncertainties, positions the Subianto-Gibran duo as potential harbingers of continuity and progress.
